Welcome to the Executive Induction program

This program is undertaken by all new SAES and non-SAES executives in their first year as an executive.

The Office of the Commissioner for Public Sector Employment is responsible for the delivery of the Executive Induction Program, a mandatory 2-day program for all newly appointed SA public sector executives.

A Direction of the Premier under Section 10 of the Public Sector Act 2009, all new South Australian Executive Services (SAES) executives must participate in a SAES Induction Program within the first 12 months of a SAES contract.

The program features approximately 20 speakers from across the public sector and external organisations. It focuses on the critical knowledge that South Australian executives need to deliver on the government's economic and strategic priorities, and comprises a variety of presentations, facilitated discussions and Q&A sessions.

Experienced leaders, ministers, chief executives, and other highly regarded experts present the sessions and provide high-level insight into the challenges and opportunities of leadership in the South Australian Government. The program encourages and promotes executives to develop cross-government networks.
